ABOUT NEW ENDEAVORS BY WOMEN

NEW ENDEAVORS BY WOMEN (NEW) is a nonpartisan 501(c)(3)

nonprofit that partners with women experiencing homelessness to create new futures by offering individualized support and services to end the cycle of homelessness. This includes providing housing, individualized case management and goal setting, life skills development, education, and employment opportunities.

Since its founding in 1988, NEW has been recognized for the value and scale of its impact, both nationally and locally. This includes receiving grant awards and allocations from public and private sources who understand that NEW is poised to support an underserved demographic in DC: women experiencing homelessness.

With a history of 35+ years of operation, NEW has a proven track record of successfully supporting its community members. 95% of its residents transition to permanent housing.

NEW serves women and their children who are experiencing homelessness in the city of DC, who have experienced financial hardships, domestic violence, substance-use issues, mental illness, and/or trauma. The organization provides individualized support including case workers, programming, and financial literacy training.



PROGRAMS

OUR SIX housing programs provide shelter and support services, with specific programs for clients recovering from domestic abuse; living with HIV/AIDS; and women age 55+ who have experienced chronic illness and long-term instability.

Because approximately 25% of women experiencing homelessness in DC are accompanied by their children, we also manage a Youth Enrichment Program (YEP!) to break generational cycles of homelessness.





NEW TRANSITIONS is a transitional shelter offering up to 24 months of intensive supportive services.



SHELTER PLUS CARE provides private apartments and highly individualized supportive services.



NEW HORIZONS provides private apartments and family-centered intensive services for many who are recovering from domestic abuse and mental illness.



YOUTH ENRICHMENT PROGRAM (YEP!) provides academic support and life skills development to our youth residents living in New Horizons, in grades 1 to 8.



NEW JOURNEYS offers permanent-supportive housing and support in a dorm-style setting for six women aged 55 and older, most of whom have chronic illness and have been without stable housing for many years.



NEW JOURNEYS II provides private apartments and trauma-informed services.



KATHY'S HOUSE serves women with chronic needs in apartments and a shared permanent, supportive home setting.

FINANCIALS

IN 2022, New Endeavors by Women had the opportunity to purchase the building that houses one of our housing programs, New Journey's II, for a deeply discounted price. The purchase and immediate maintenance needed on the building impacted NEW's reserves but was necessary to continue to provide housing to 15 women aged 55+ who have experienced homelessness.

Compounding this challenge is the uncertain impact of federal decisions on the nonprofit sector, particularly in housing services. With 75% of our funding coming from government


grants—through Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and DC's Department of Human Services—policy shifts at the federal and local levels could have significant implications for our programs.

For 37 years, New Endeavors by Women has weathered many challenges and provided permanent housing and effective programs to over 3,900 women. As we move forward, we remain committed to securing diverse funding sources to ensure we can continue partnering with women and their children for years to come.






- 149 adult clients served
